We will be learning...

English: We will be looking at Fables and creating our own narratives based on these. We will also be writing a biography linked to Black History Month.

Maths: We will be furthering our knowledge of place value up to 10,000 and refining our methods for addition and subtraction.

Reading: Our class text is 'The Nothing To See Here Hotel'. We will also be reading books using Bug Club.

History: Invasions - from Anglo-Saxons through to the Norman Conquest.

Science: We will be learning about ecosystems, food, teeth and the digestive system.

Geography: Interconnected World - our topic includes using a compass, grid references and exploring climate through North and South America.

PSHE: Being me in my world

We also have a variety of RE, PE, music, French and computing. units too!



Homework will continue to be set online each week through Atom Learning. The homework set is relevant to our current topics and ongoing learning.

Maths – Set on a Monday, due Friday.

English – Set on Wednesday, due the following Tuesday.

Reading – The children should read at least three times each week and this is recorded into their reading diary. Any reading counts – independent, reading aloud, recipes, instructions etc! Diaries should be handed in on a Monday. Recorded reading = prizes!

Times Table Rockstars – in Year 4, times tables are particularly important as we work towards the statutory Multiplication Check at the end of the year. Practise makes perfect, so we encourage the children to log into TTRS each week. This not only helps to build confidence but also gains points for our in-school battles!
