Important! Accessing 30 hours childcare or Tax-Free Childcare, or wanting to apply to start in January 2024?

If your child is receiving 30 hours childcare or Tax-Free Childcare make sure you re-confirm your information; or apply for the funding **before the 31 December 2023** to ensure that your child receives their entitlement with no gaps or delays from January 2024. To re-confirm* or apply, visit: https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/

*Parents who already access the funding must check their childcare account to re-confirm.

Universal Credit help with childcare costs has increased



The Department for Work and Pensions have raised the amount that parents can claim back monthly for their childcare costs on Universal Credit of up to £951 for one child and £1,630 for two or more children.

The Government will help eligible parents cover the costs for the first month's childcare when they enter work or significantly increase their hours. Those parents will also receive up to 85% of their childcare costs back before their next month's bills are due — meaning they should have money to pay one month in advance going forward. Parents should contact their Work Coach for further information and accessing the support.

Parents and carers in Hampshire can access **free online courses** to help build their confidence and better
understand the behaviour, development and mental
health of their child or young person. The **'Solihull Approach'** courses have been specially designed by
psychologists and professionals and tailored to different
