Summer weather ... watch out, ticks are about!

Ticks are becoming much more common now across large parts of England, particularly in woodlands and the countryside. Ticks are blood sucking members of the spider family, and we have about 20 species in the UK.



Always check your body for any signs of ticks at the end of a day in the countryside, and if you do find any ticks feeding, remove the tick promptly with tweezers, clean the bite site with an antiseptic wipe. Also watch for any symptoms of Lyme disease, remembering to consult your GP if you feel unwell. The infection can be serious if not treated. This three-minute video will give you details on how to remove the tick and things to look out for.
